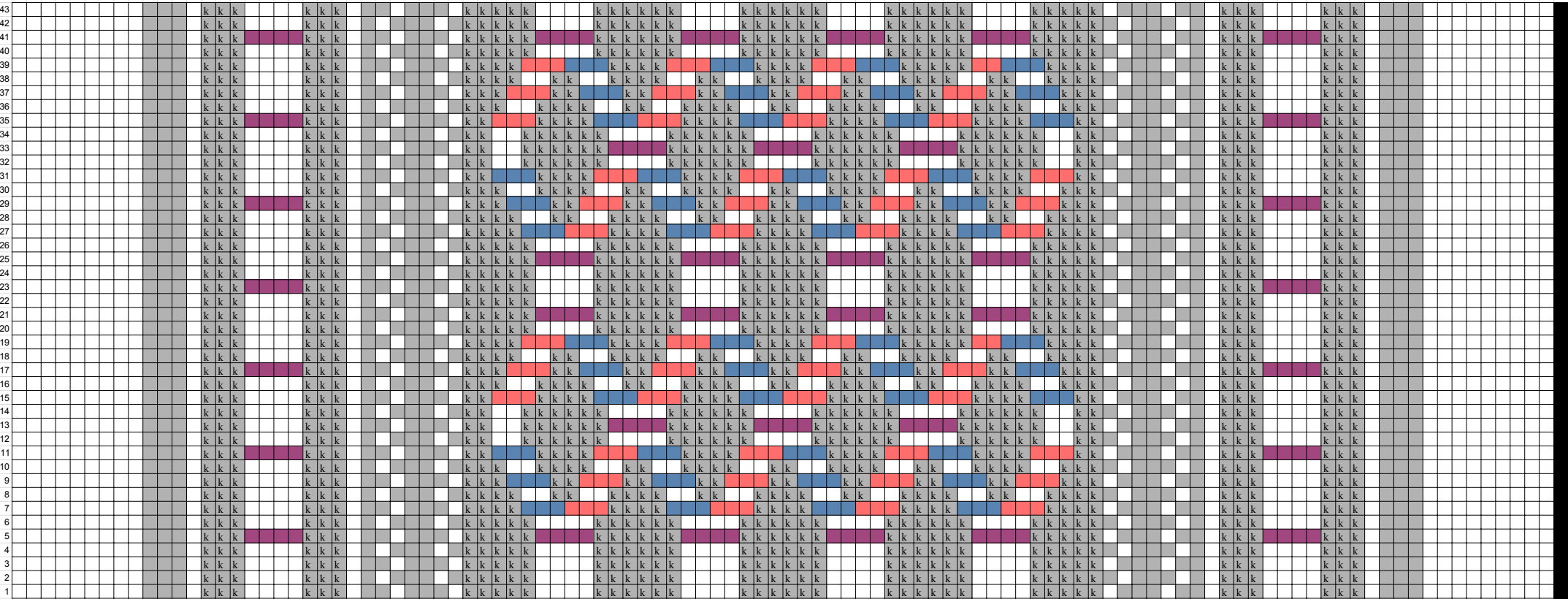


The Horde Charts Collection including the Horde Cables (first chart) and the Horde Logo (second chart) by AnCo Design, 2022 ©



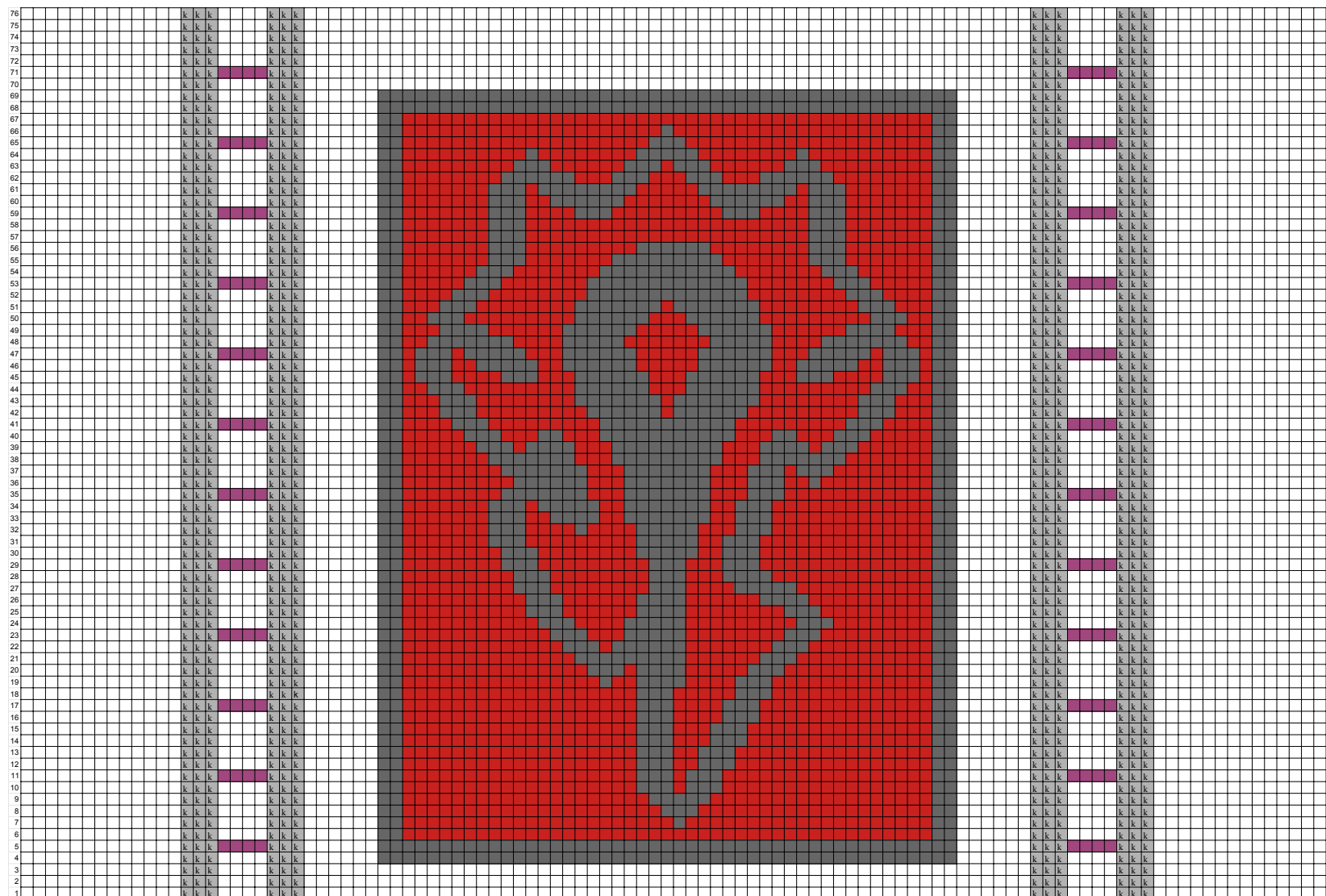
- Accent color
- Background color
- k Garter stitch (k stands for kraus from the German „kraus rechts stricken“)
- Stockinette stitch
- Slip 2 stitches onto cable needle, hold in back, k2, k2 from cable needle
- Slip 2 stitches onto cable needle, hold in front, k1, k2 from cable needle
- Slip 1 stitch onto cable needle, hold in back, k2, k1 from cable needle
- End of knitting chart

Information:

I made this knitting chart in a way that seems easiest understandable for me. I don't state in which rows you purl or knit in stockinette stitch as for me that would have been too messy. I knitted the uneven rows and purled the even rows for stockinette stitch. I knitted a sweater with this chart from bottom up, so I started in row 1.
